Des Moines Public Schools is requesting that students attending one of our Alternative Education programs be required to participate in Contract PE. Students would participate in a physical activity a minimum of 15 hours for one semester of each school year. An application would be completed and signed by the student, parent/guardian, and the Building PE Chairperson. Students would receive a Pass/Fail Grade.

c) The sources of supportive research evidence and information, when appropriate, that were analyzed and used to form the basis of each rationale. In the box below, provide at least one research citation.

These educational facilities are not traditional schools; they are programs within the Des Moines Public School District. Courses in the Alternative Programs are offered in a flexible, non-traditional format. These programs serve many different purposes from allowing a student to receive a credit that they may need in order to graduate to perhaps helping a student re-enter the education environment.

Classes are also smaller which promotes interaction between students and staff. Courses may be started and completed at any time during the school year. Thus, credits can be earned any time during the school year.

These alternative programs are designed to provide instruction, organization, and discipline to meet individual needs. Students receive small group and individualized instruction and counseling.

The purpose of Des Moines Public Schools alternative middle school education program is to provide students with an alternative learning environment, supported by a low student-to-teacher ratio, where they can successfully continue their middle school education. A major focus is on strengthening academic competence and enhancing self-worth. This structured setting provides students with individual academic attention to maximize achievement.

d) How the school or school district staff collaborated with the local community or with the school improvement advisory committee about the need for the exemption request. In the box below, describe how local stakeholders played a role in determining that this request for exemption from accreditation standards is appropriate and needed.

Based on the buildings where many of these programs are held, there are no gym facilities available. The options for physical activity are limited and behaviors often interfere as well.

Success of these alternative programs is based on students demonstrating good behaviors and making academic progress ultimately leading to the student either returning to their home school or meeting graduation requirements. Many students also participate in job training and other programs to prepare them for life after high school.

The primary focus of the alternative programs is on behavior. We must help the students manage their behavior so they can learn. Success in improving student achievement will be measured by the number of office referrals, student's grades or course completion, and the number of students returning to their home schools and/or the number of students graduating.
